



Peter R. Pawlik, PhD, born 1946, is chairman of the Association of Healthcare Architects of the Society of German Architects AKG/BDA. He is delegated member of the Public Health Group of the UIA International Union of Architects and member in the directors board of the German Society for the History of Hospitals.

He has specialized in Hospital Architecture since his studies at the Institute of Hospital Planning at the Berlin Technical University in the early seventies. At this University he received his doctorate for his dissertation "Analysis of German hospital guidelines and their consequences for the building and running costs" (1984)

He has built about 100 Projects and 55 hospitals between 1977 and 2007, among others St. Joseph Hospital, Behring hospital (with Gottfried Böhm) in Berlin, district hospital in Salzwedel, St. Marienstift in Magdeburg, DRK hospitals in Chemnitz and Berlin, district hospital in Sikasso/ Republic of Mali and a 4 star hotel for handicapped people in Rheinsberg/ Germany, decorated with the Core Award for best hotel design of the year.

Pawlik wrote numerous publications and gave lectures with hospital-specific and hospital-historic contents, in Germany and Worldwide.

Pawlik published the following books:

Moshe Zarhy, born in 1923 in Jerusalem, counts among the second generation of architects, who have contributed decisively to shaping the face of today's modern state of Israel. By his functional, aesthetic and unadorned style he can be seen in direct succession to the founding fathers of Israeli architecture, who – in the twenties and thirties of the twentieth century – laid the foundation for the settlement of Palestine.

In his life as an architect he has achieved supreme international recognition. Numerous national as well as international distinctions were conferred upon him. One field of work, however, has been of particular interest to Moshe Zarhy since the beginning of his activities: Health Facilities. It is in this field that he has achieved mastery by a multitude of outstanding and groundbreaking hospitals. In addition to the projects of his speciality, the construction of hospitals, this publication also gives insight into the other fields of his substantial work.

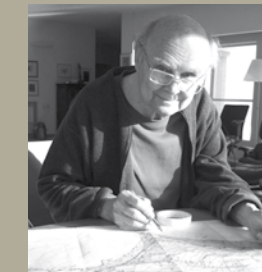

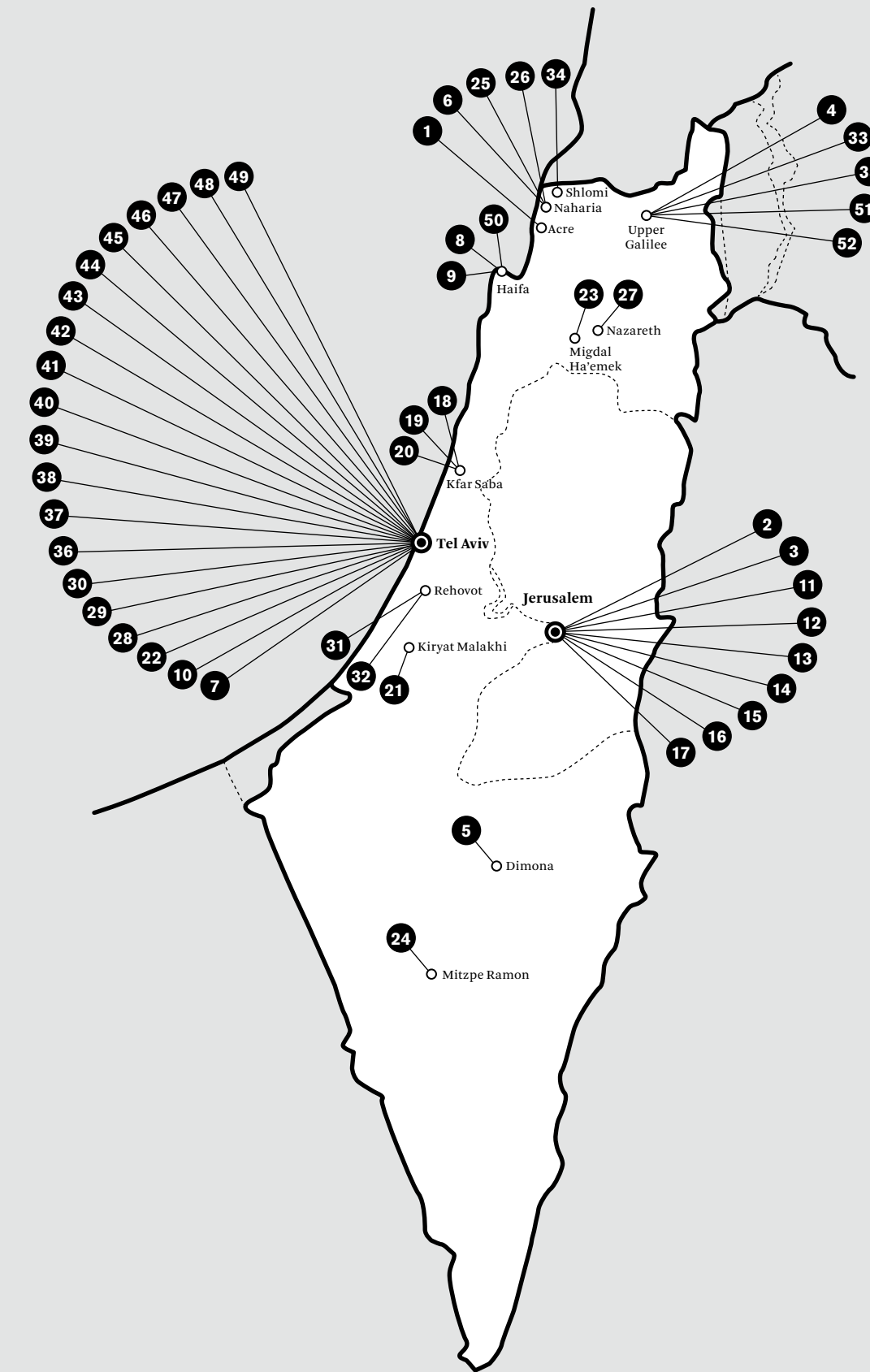


Moshe Zarhy was born in Jerusalem in 1923. Graduated from the Technion – Israel Institute of Technology, Haifa in 1945 and concluded post-graduate studies at the Ecole d' Urbanisme in Paris in 1949–1950. He has been practicing since 1950.

Moshe Zarhy is the Founder of Zarhy Architects. He was joined at the firm by his son, architect David Zarhy and architect Anat Patrycha Zarhy in 1978. They currently run the firm. The firm is active in all areas of architectural planning; public institutions, housing projects, urban planning, private homes, education buildings, hotels and commercial buildings, sports facilities and IDF (Israel Defense Forces) projects. Special emphasis has been put on planning and developing Medical Centers, Health Facilities, Science and High-Tech facilities. Moshe Zarhy's main projects are the Sheba Medical Center in Tel Aviv with 700 beds; the Meir Medical Center in Kfar Saba with 620 beds; about 4,200 dwelling units at 11 different locations; the ATIDIM Industrial Park in Tel Aviv and several Hi-Tech Projects, as Iscar Industries in Upper Galilee and the Weizmann Institute of Science in Rehovot.

During 60 years of professional experience Moshe Zarhy has provided comprehensive architectural services for numerous major building projects. He is the author of many professional papers. His projects have been widely documented in the international professional press. He has been involved in the International Union of Architects' (UIA) since the mid-sixties. As a voting member of the Public Health Working Group, Zarhy has represented the Israeli National Section in all UIA Congresses since 1969. He was UIA Council Member during the years 1990–1993, was elected UIA vice President Region II for the terms of 1993–1996–1999, and has served as Director of the UIA Work Programme "Architecture for Science and Hi-Tech Facilities" since 1999. Moshe Zarhy has been elected as FAIA – Fellow of the American Institute of Architects.
